Council to consider a request from the West Arthur Football Club for a net contribution of \$1,072.50 towards purchase and installation of submersible septic pump at the Darkan oval kitchen and changeroom facility.

BACKGROUND:

The WAF Club is seeking financial assistance towards the cost of the purchase of a submersible pump, associated plumbing and installation at the Darkan oval kitchen and changeroom facility. This will replace the existing failed pump and will be fitted for ease of service in the future.

The total cost of the project including volunteer labour is \$3,145 of which the club requests \$1,072.50 from the Shire.

Whilst this facility is only being used once per year by the football club to host a Wagin Football Club match, the Darkan junior sports (not an official club) are using the facility to run Auskick, Milo Cricket, Net Set Go and maybe more in the future. The group has been running for two years now and participation has been very high. This group has provided an opportunity for young children to be involved in sports, teamwork, being active and participation. It also provides an outlet for parents to socialise, learn coaching skills and volunteer. The junior sports has fundraised and already purchased and replaced items in the clubroom kitchen including stainless steel benches, fridge and oven.

CONSULTATION:

Consultation has been carried out with the West Arthur Football Club, Darkan & Districts Sports Complex and Darkan junior sports members.

The policy states that under the Community Financial Assistance Program, Council will fund up to \$5,000 and no more than 50% of the total cost of a project. In special circumstances Council may consider a higher contribution; justification will need to be provided by the applicant.
